

# How to use Canvas

## Introduction

Canvas is a 'Virtual Learning Environment'. We're going to be using it on this course as a space for you to interact with your tutor group and mentor, and to download and submit your work over the summer.


## Logging in

You will be given an account and should receive an email inviting you to join the 'Preparing for the PAT' course, with a link to the course. You need to use this the first time to register.

After that, you can go to <http://canvas.ox.ac.uk> to log in with your email address and password.

## Tutor groups

You are part of a tutor group of 10 students and your mentor. All of the groups are named after areas of Oxford. To find the pages for your group, go to the 'Groups' button on the left hand side, and then click on the name of your group.

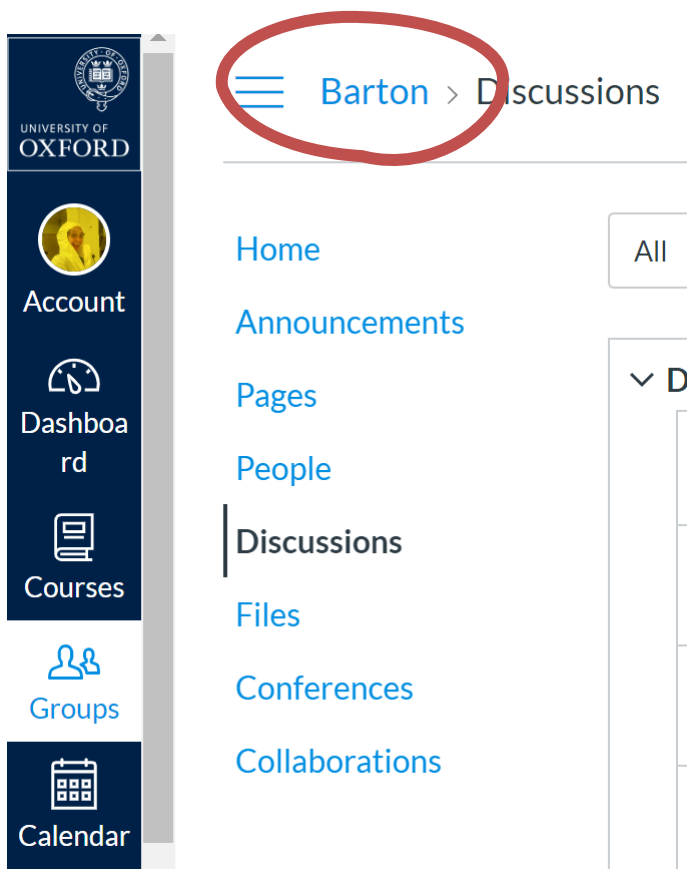

## Pages



 **Warm-up problems**

- The 'Modules' are where we will be posting course materials that you will need.
- We will use 'Announcements' when we need to contact everyone, for example if something changes or we release extra materials.
- You can use 'Discussions' to talk to the whole group (150 students). Use this for general questions and chat, rather than questions or thoughts about the work.

## Notifications

Make sure you have set up your notifications so that you are notified when you want of things that change on the site. You can do this by clicking on 'Account' then 'Notifications'. You can choose whether you get notifications for different things emailed to you immediately, as a summary daily or weekly, or never.
